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Kindergarten Readiness Event to Unite Cobb

Marietta, Georgia - To Kindergarten and Beyond... Hasta el Kinder y Más Allá is a collaborative effort being lead by Communities In Schools of Marietta/Cobb County (CISMCC) that will bring families with children, under six-years-old, together with organizations dedicated to child well-being and success in school.

As a dropout prevention organization, CISMCC's Parents as Teachers (PAT) program starts working with families at birth! Early childhood support from PAT and other quality early education programs have proven to be a cost-effective and successful intervention.

On June 14th at First Presbyterian Church Marietta (189 Church St) from 6-8pm, parents and caregivers with children under six are invited to partake in a free dinner sponsored by Children's Health Care of Atlanta (CHOA), to mingle with community organizations, play the Brain Architecture Game led by The Georgia Early Education Alliance for Ready Students (GEEARS) and to be part of Spanish and English panels discussing everything parents will want to know before their child enters Kindergarten.

Other organizations that will be in attendance include; Revved Up Kids, Safe Routes to School GA, CHOA Strong4Life, Amerigroup, WellCare, Cobb County Public Library System, YMCA ELR Program, and Life University's Center for Health and Optimum Performance.
